

The Board works hard yearround writing and lobbying the Mayor, the Board of Supervisors, US and State Senators and Assembly members on behalf of SFWPC women.

EMILY MURASE APPOINTED AS DIRECTOR OF THE DEPARTMENT ON THE STATUS OF WOMEN

Mayor Gavin Newsom has recently appointed Emily Murase as Director for the Department on the Status of Women.

Emily brings a wealth of policy expertise to the position, she previously served as Director for International Economic Affairs under the Clinton Administration, where she prepared policy recommendations for the President and senior policymakers on Japan and China, in addition to intellectual property rights. From January 1995 to July 1996, Emily was a Telecommunications Specialist for Asia-Pacific for the U.S. Federal Communications Commission.

Emily has served on the Commission on the Status of Women since 1998, including service as Vice President. She is currently on the Parent Teacher Community Council Board for the Japanese Bilingual and Bicultural Program. She is active in the EMERGE Leadership Training Program, a program for women across the Northern California interested in political participation. In 2000, she received the Outstanding Asian Women Award from the Asian Women's Resource Center.

The Department on the Status of Women aims to foster the advancement of the status of women and girls, particularly those issues that impact marginalized women and girls, both within City and County government and in the private sector.

Commissioners for the Department on the Status of Women include Andrea Shorter, President; Juanita Miles, Vice-President; Andrea Evans, Dorka Keehn, Carolene Marks and Angela Williams.

VOTING REQUIREMENTS & ATTENDANCE CREDITS

ELIGIBILITY TO VOTE

To be eligible to vote, you must have been a SFWPC member for 60 days and attended at least 3 SFWPC events in the last 12 months. If you have met the attendance requirement but your membership has lapsed, you can renew at this event. These meeting dates DO NOT include attendance at the Endorsement Committee meeting to seek an endorsement. Membership renewal dues are \$25.00 Annual and \$10 for Senior/Students/Limited Income .
